## RULES & GAMES

### BIRDS

#### **OVERALL RULES**

- Absolutely no alcohol allowed on the premises of the McKenzie County Sportsman's Club.
- Ear and eye protection must be worn at all times and will be provided for your convenience.
- All personal firearms must be kept in a case or on a rack and unloaded when not in use.

#### **ARCHERY**

Each team member will shoot 10 arrows at 80cm bullseye targets using Genesis bows provided by the 4-H Badlands Archery Club. Max 100 points per individual; max 400 points per team.

#### RIMFIRE

Each team member will shoot 5 spot targets at 30-40 yards; 5 rounds shot in each position - standing, kneeling, sitting, and prone. Each team gets a box of 100 rounds of ammunition to be used in .22 caliber rifles. Scoring will be 5/4/3/2 points. Max 400 points per team.

#### TRAP

Each team member must supply their own 12-guage shotgun (kept in a case or on a rack and unloaded when not in use). Each will receive 1 box (25 rounds) of 12-guage ammunition. Each team member will shoot a full round of 25 for trap. Each bird broken will score 4 points. Max 100 points per individual; max 400 points per team.

#### **ADDITIONAL GAMES**

**Rimfire Target Practice:** Individuals can purchase 5 additional rounds of .22 ammunition for \$10 to shoot at 5 metal targets placed at 50 yards. Each participant will be given a ticket for each target hit for a prize drawing.

**Pellet Gun Firing Range:** Individuals can buy 2 minutes in the Pellet Gun Firing Range for \$10. Each participant will be given a ticket for a prize drawing.

Prizes also awarded to the top 2 individual high scorers in each discipline.

#### BIRDIES

#### 16-HOLE MAX BOGEY GOLF SCRAMBLE

Each 4-person team will play in a 16-hole max bodey golf scramble.

#### **ADDITIONAL GAMES**

**Money Ball:** Teams can purchase a numbered green ball for \$25. The ball is to by played throughout the course. If a team has the ball at the end of the scramble, the ball will be placed into a drawing for a prize. Teams may purchase more than one ball.

Course Games: Longest Putt, Closest to the Pin, Longest Drive (Men's and Women's)

Team winners will be determined from a combined score of both the Birds and Birdies competitions.

Prizes will also be awarded for 2nd and 3rd Overall Team Winners.

Winners must be present to claim a door prize. Door prizes will be available for pick-up at the awards social at Fox Hills Golf Course following the Birdies portion of the tournament.
